A planned gift can be a bequest in your Will, a gift through a Trust, a Charitable Gift Annuity, Life Insurance and/or any other instrument that provides for a gift that will be realized at a later date. Charitable IRA Rollover

On December 18, 2015, Congress passed the permanent enactment of the Charitable IRA Rollover. The Charitable IRA Rollover allows individuals over age 70½ to directly transfer up to \$100,000 per year from an IRA account to one or more charities. Several of our donors have used the Charitable IRA Rollover to provide support for Snyder Village through the years.

Caterpillar Foundation Matching Gifts for 2021


