Pancake and Sausage Supper

- The 2023 Annual Snyder Village "Pancake and Sausage Supper" was a successful event. Nearly 400 people were in attendance! An excellent group of volunteers led by our Event Chair, Chris Nauman, made things go smoothly for the first Pancake and Sausage event in four years! The event raised \$1,749.85 for the Resident In Need Fund. This compares to the last four years of the Pancake and Sausage Breakfast and Auction from 2016 through 2019 where we averaged 749 breakfasts served and netted an average of \$1,913.00 for the combined Ice Cream Social, Pancake and Sausage Breakfast and Saturday Concessions! The expense of the tent used during those years was listed as a separate expense item and did not factor into the net dollars raised average for those four years.
