Staff will continue spring P/M's next week. During these visits, we will check your air conditioning unit, clean under appliances, clean your dryer vent, as well as check other items in your cottage.

Roofing, siding, and aluminum work will begin the week of 7/17. Blue Line Construction will be on campus for approximately 10 weeks. Roughly 125 of the 170 cottages and half of the Assisted Living will have their roof replaced and some cottages will have siding and aluminum work replaced. Blue Line will work Monday thru Saturday to help expediate the replacements. Colors of the roofs have been determined with most cottages being replaced with either the same or a similar color. I will be communicating with each resident the week before their cottage is scheduled.
