According to the American Physical Therapy Association, inadequate levels of physical activity result in an added \$117 billion in health care costs in the U.S. and leads to a reduced quality of life for millions of Americans. For those recovering from injury or learning to live with physical limitations, physical therapists can help identify, diagnose, and treat movement problems.
