

# Chaplain's Message

Shampoo bottles often say: "wash, rinse, repeat." This algorithm has likely boosted sales more than any marketing campaign. Similarly, the author of Hebrews repeats a point for emphasis: under the Law, sacrifices were made "again and again," proving that those sacrifices could "never take away sins" (v. 11).

Christ's priesthood offers "one sacrifice for sins" and then "sat down at the right hand of God" (v. 12). His work is finished. Two facts confirm this: He is now at rest, (v. 13), and His sacrifice has "made perfect forever those who are being made holy" (v. 14).

Though we still grow in holiness, our obedience adds nothing to Christ's perfect work. He has provided a perfect righteousness that cannot be improved upon. Sanctification –

the Spirit's work of shaping us – flows from forgiveness and justification. God writes His Law on our hearts (v. 16), not to earn salvation, but to reflect it. Sanctification always begins with forgiveness and justification through Christ. Where there has been forgiveness, there is no longer any need for sacrifice (vv. 17-18).

**Go Deeper:** Read *Hebrews 10:11-18* - What is sanctification? How does it begin? How have you experienced it? Pray with us: Jesus, thank You that Your sacrifice has made a way for us to have a relationship with you and is making us new each day.
